# 4 Steps to get detailed Insights...

#### Step 1 - Validate your Eligibility (1)

R4 - Leading Researcher (Researchers leading their research area or field)

R3 - Established Researcher (Researchers who have developed a level of independence)

R2 - **Recognised Researcher** (PhD holders or equivalent who are not yet fully independent)

R1 - First Stage Researcher (Up to the point of PhD)

## Aims of the Exercise

### Evaluation 1. Current State of Research

R1: As for transnational intellectual and university history <u>she surely has</u>. As for migration history, there are <u>some deficiencies [...]</u>. Especially the theoretical and typological work by [...] (..., <u>2013</u>), [...] (..., <u>2009</u> and <u>2011</u>). As does [...] et al. <u>2011</u>. Given the central questions and research design she will have <u>little trouble hooking up</u> with these new

approaches.

R2: ...clearly has a tremendously <u>strong understanding of the relevant histories</u> along with a <u>real sense of the</u> <u>contribution</u> she will make to it. I am very <u>impressed with her control of the materials</u>.



### Evaluation 2. Research Questions

R2: ...<u>absolutely clear</u>. Even more importantly, there is a <u>genuine gap which will be filled</u> by Ms. XYZ's research

R1: In general, yes. But [...] she could profit very much by using new approaches and typologies...

R3: Yes, these are all quite <u>clear and valid</u>.



# Evaluation 3. Originality & Relevance (1)

R1: ...<u>highly original</u> research project and <u>fits very well in the new directions</u> in migration history...

R1: ...possibility to <u>link up with recent work</u> on cultural industries [...]. When <u>embedded in these new</u> <u>directions</u> it has the potential to become <u>really cutting edge.</u>

*R2: ...truly exciting research project, <u>bringing together</u> the history of anthropology, the history of migration, ...* 

R2: ...will <u>greatly contribute to our understanding</u> of the history of the behavioral sciences in general, and its transnational aspects in particular...

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# Evaluation 3. Originality & Relevance (2)

R2: Having <u>myself worked on the transnational aspects</u> in the history of German anthropology [...], I am truly <u>excited about this innovative proposition</u>.

R3: ...<u>fits into current trends in both the history of science as well as history more generally</u>,

R3: <u>My only advice [...]</u> would be not to limit the study to a East-West exchange but to be aware of the broader circulation [...]



Evaluation 4. Work Plan

R1: <u>No problems here</u>, as far as I can judge.

R2: ...project is <u>clearly articulated</u>, especially in regard to the various archival collections that need to be consulted [...] fact that <u>some of those are not even open to the general scholarly</u> public is particularly exciting.

R3: Yes, I see <u>no problems</u> with the time line or the proposed methods.



# Evaluation 5. Applicant

R2: ...brings a <u>strong set of experiences and expertise</u> to her research...

R2 ... <u>excellent training</u> in [...], which is <u>essential to her success</u>...

*R2: What shows [her] readiness most clearly, however, is her research proposal, which [...] shows <u>tremendous</u> <u>understanding of the stakes of her project</u>.* 

R3: Judging from the **quality of the proposal** she also has the ability to write up a high quality paper as well.





## Evaluation 6. Scientific Environment

R1: <u>Excellent</u> [...], she could easily turn to the group [...] at Vienna University, who have an <u>excellent track</u> <u>record</u>...

R2: <u>I cannot think of a better constellation</u> of scholars and institutional resources for this project.

R3: <u>These are good choices</u>. Adding to them would not necessarily enhance the project.

*R1: I recommend preferential acceptance*.
